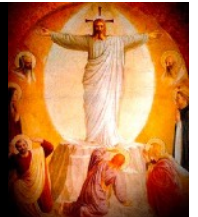

### THE FEAST OF ST DOMINIC - 3 AUGUST FOUNDER OF THE DOMINICAN ORDER

Born at Calaruega (Spain) about 1170, Dominic was an Augustinian canon noted for prayer, penance, and an exemplary life. In a time of violent crusades he sought reconciliation



through instruction and prayer. He established the **Order of Preachers** (Dominicans) to revitalise the Church through study, teaching, preaching, and prayer. He is remembered as a preacher, organiser, and patron of learning. He died at Bologna (Italy) on 6 August 1221. His feast day was moved to 3 August to enable the day to be dedicated to Australia's first saint, St Mary of the Cross.

## TODAY'S READINGS:

### **First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14**

Daniel's vision illustrates the fiery Power of the Universe, seated on a flaming throne, with thousands waiting on and seated in God's presence, until the books are opened and the One arrives on the clouds of heaven to be crowned.

### **Responsorial Psalm:**

*The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth.*

Cloud and darkness are the clothes of God the most high, and mountains melt before the Lord, who is exalted above all.

### **Second Reading: 2 Peter 1:16-19**

Peter reminds his readers of Jesus' Transfiguration on the mountaintop, where 'the Sublime Glory itself' acclaimed Jesus as God's Beloved Son.

### **Gospel Reading: Matthew 17:1-9**

Jesus is transfigured on the mountaintop before his chosen companions, Peter, James and John. God instructs the disciples from the clouds, 'listen to him'.

## A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured: his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were taking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'

## COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

What the three disciples see at the Transfiguration is a glimpse of Jesus in the glory that belongs to him as "Son of the living God." He is as much "at home" here, transfigured on the mountain top, as he is walking the roads and lakeshore of Galilee with them.

The glory glimpsed by the disciples is the same glory that Jesus promises to share with us in heaven each time we receive Holy Communion.

Jesus, throughout his life on earth moved, between the divine and human worlds, as indicated when we see him at one moment going to sleep in the fishing boat with his disciples, and shortly afterwards commanding the wind and the waves when he stills the storm.

The Father's words "Listen to him" at the Transfiguration refer especially to what Jesus has been saying to his disciples about his need to suffer and die, and the same need for those who would follow him. It is precisely as God's beloved Son that Jesus will suffer and die.

Moses and Elijah were the two people in the Old Testament who came closest to God in biblical tradition. Both experienced revelations of God on a mountain top. Now Peter, James and John have shared that experience. But they do not need to remain on the mountain top, as Peter would like to do, because whenever they are with Jesus they are with God.

That surely is the point we are meant to take away with us today. We too are "with Jesus", and that means "with God". That is what our receiving the Eucharist is telling us. And we need his presence to guide us on our way into eternal life.

## SAINT MARY OF THE CROSS

AUGUST 8



Mary Helen MacKillop (15 January 1842 - 8 August 1909), also known as Saint Mary of the Cross, was an Australian Roman Catholic nun who, together with Father Julian Tenison Woods, founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart and a number of schools and welfare institutions throughout Australasia with an emphasis on education for the poor, particularly in country areas. Since her death she has attracted much veneration in Australia and internationally.

On 17 July 2008, Pope Benedict XVI prayed at her tomb during his visit to Sydney for World Youth Day 2008. On 19 December 2009, Pope Benedict XVI approved the Roman Catholic Church's recognition of a second miracle attributed to her intercession. She was canonised on 17 October 2010 during a public ceremony in St Peter's Square at the Vatican. She is the only Australian to be recognised by the Roman Catholic Church as a saint.

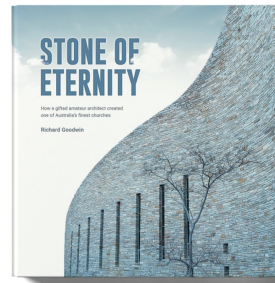
