A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a Devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors

Can you think of any other place in the gospels where Jesus is convinced by someone to do something quite the opposite of what he had already decided on as a matter of principle. I can't. But in today's gospel that is what happens. Jesus had decided that he should not cure the Canaanite woman's daughter because he was sent by his Father to save "the lost sheep of the house of Israel," and this woman is a pagan. Three times Jesus refuses to do what she wants.

But the main point of the story is that he changes his mind as a result of the extraordinary and persistent faith of this pagan woman. Her faith has broken through the barrier set up by Jesus' understanding of his Father's will.

How does all that help me, you might say. It reminds me of a highly publicised comment made some time ago by Pope Francis. It concerned homosexual people living with a partner. His comment was, "Who am I to judge?" Most of Jesus' companions in today's gospel would have taken for granted that the pagan woman was a sinner. But St Matthew makes her the only person in the gospel who convinces Jesus to change his mind, and is praised for her faith.

Two conclusions: Firstly, we should be very slow to judge anyone. Secondly, faith can achieve extraordinary results.

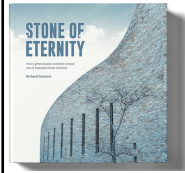
P.S. Mary also convinced Jesus to change his mind at the marriage feast of Cana.
