TODAY'S READINGS:

First Reading: Isaiah 22:19-23

The reading allows for God to declare who holds keys, who binds and frees. It also reminds that when these powers are used out of alignment with the divine ways, a shake-up will come about.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 137:1-3, 6,8 Lord, your love is eternal; do not forsake the work of your hands.

This psalm of thankfulness also echoes the authority of God that looks on the lowly, the one who opens and shuts the doors, who has comforting control over all things.

Second Reading: Romans 11:33-36

The apostle to the gentiles is allowing us a sense of the mystery of God's love as unfathomable and without end.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 16:13-20

The Gospel establishes the importance of the role of Peter amongst the followers and goes on to the place of reconciliation within the Church.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philipi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist. come Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said, 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven: whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the christ.

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors


Would we all agree that the main thing our Church has to offer the world is the knowledge of God: that God does exist and this is what God is like? How much do we value knowing all that we have learnt in the Church about God? And not only knowing about God, but actually knowing God personally as creator, lover, saviour, friend, forgiver. Can we even imagine what our lives would be like if we did not have this knowledge we call faith? How anxious are we that others come to share it? These are some of the questions we might think worth reflecting on in the light of the gospel we have just heard.

So the question Jesus asks Peter and the other disciples in today's gospel is a very important one, "Who do you say that I am?" In other words, How well do you know me? This time Peter comes up trumps with the right answer, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Peter's deepening relationship with Jesus has revealed to him that through Jesus he is in touch with God.

Led by Pope Francis, the Church today is reminding us that we are all called to be evangelisers, to draw others into a loving relationship with God, through Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit which has been given to us. The way we live, what we say, and our major concerns and attitudes in life will influence others. Can we call this our best way of evangelising?

However, today being Social Justice Sunday we might also remember that if our evangelising efforts do not include an active concern for justice in our world and a practical compassion for the suffering, our efforts at evangelising could seem like a sham.



The Passion of St John the Baptist August 29

'Now Herod had arrested John, bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip, for John had said to him, "It is not lawful for you to have her." Although he wanted to kill him, he feared the people, for they regarded him as a prophet. But at a birthday celebration for Herod, the daughter of Herodias performed a dance before the guests and delighted Herod so much that he swore to give her whatever she might ask for. Prompted by her mother, she said, "Give me here on a platter the head of John the Baptist." The king was distressed, but because of his oaths and the guests who were present, he ordered that it be given, and he had John beheaded in the prison. His head was brought in on a platter and given to the girl, who took it to her mother. His disciples came and took away the corpse and buried him; and they went and told Jesus.' ~ Matthew 14:3-12
