TODAY'S READINGS:

First Reading: Jeremiah 20:7-9

Jeremiah laments his utter devotion to God's will. He is simply a pawn in God's plan, a man whose heart cannot be swayed from the burning truth of God's love.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 62:2-6, 8-9

My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

Second Reading: Romans 12:1-2

St Paul encourages the Romans to allow God's mercy to fill their lives, to ignore the behaviour of the world, so that their only desire be for God.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 16:21-27

Jesus foretells of his impending Passion to his disciples. Peter protests in an attempt to dissuade him, and Jesus explains the true meaning of discipleship.

<u>A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL</u> <u>ACCORDING TO MATTHEW</u>

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter starts to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We can't help feeling sorry for Peter in this gospel. Just before this passage Jesus called Peter 'Blessed' because he had recognised Jesus as Son of God. Yet now he calls him 'Satan', the one who tempted Jesus during his forty day fast after his baptism by John the Baptist.

Peter was trying to convince Jesus that he should not be saying he was going to be put to death. After all, he was God's Son. But Jesus' response to Peter was to tell him to get behind him. That is where a disciple belongs, even if it means following him to death.

That is what looks like the grim reality of this gospel: following Jesus means sharing his weakness, sufferings, failures and finally death. But in the Father's plan, that is how the world is to be redeemed and made fit for the gift of eternal life.

Peter is a model for us because although he failed Jesus by denying him three times, he was forgiven and received the gift of the Holy Spirit after Jesus' resurrection and ended up being martyred for his faith.

But we are still left with the seemingly grim challenge of Jesus to follow him and accept the suffering that this will involve. Perhaps all we can say that might be helpful is that to achieve anything worthwhile in this life means being willing to go without other things and experiences that we judge to be less important. The good news is that if we love someone or something enough, then we can be very happy while doing whatever is needed to achieve what we love.



What we are doing at Mass today is offering to the Father all our efforts to follow his Son, especially over the past week, as part of Jesus' own offering of his life to the Father.
