TODAY'S READINGS:

First Reading: Ezekiel 33:7-9

Our reading from Ezekiel supports the communal responsibility for speaking out in the face of wrongdoing. The prophet is warned that if he does not speak the word of God into situations, he too bears some of the blame for the poor outcomes that follow.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 94:1-2, 6-9

O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your hearts.

Second Reading: Romans 13:8-10

Christian teaching around love of God and neighbour. Our love for each other is a mirror of God's love for all creation and has no limits. Our debt to our neighbour is always one of love.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 16:21-27

Today Jesus is teaching us the ways of reconciliation in the community, the power of communal prayer and his presence amongst the gathered community.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus said to his disciples: 'If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone, between your two selves. If he listens to you, you have won back your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you: the evidence of two or three witnesses is required to sustain any charge. But if he refuses to listen to these, report it to the community; and if he refuses to listen to the community, treat him like a pagan or a tax collector.

'I tell you solemnly, whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.

'I tell you solemnly once again, if two of you on earth agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

"If two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in Heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them." (18:19-20).


I think it's worthwhile pausing for a moment to look into those two verses from today's gospel. At Mass we gather in Jesus' name to offer ourselves and each other, 'through him, with him, and in him,' to the Father, as the priest says, and to receive him from the Father in the Eucharist. So at Mass Jesus is not just among us as an observer – he is involved with us, as one of us, in worshipping God the Father.

Likewise, the gospel is saying that whenever we Christians come together, even two of us, because we belong to him, Jesus is among us, not just watching but involved with us in whatever we are doing. That, I think, is one main point of today's reading.

What we are doing might be eating together, working together at home or anywhere, or relaxing with friends. All of these are a part of normal living. As Christians we do them, and everything else, 'because we belong to him,' in a united effort to build the kingdom of God on earth. So Jesus is there among us as friend and supporter.

We are at the Eucharist today to become this kind of person: Christ's body on earth. And Christ is God and God is love. When we love, therefore:

- We are activating a gift received.
- We are acting in a Godlike way
- We are proclaiming what God is like
- We are proclaiming the goodness of the one we love
- We are showing love for ourselves, doing what is best for us.
- God is answering our prayer, giving what is best for us. Fr Tom.
