## A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too receive one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us, though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first, and the first, last.'

## COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

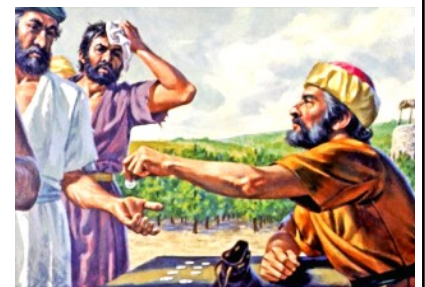
Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Does our God treat us according to strict justice, giving us exactly what we deserve? Most of us probably hope not, and today's gospel supports us. God is abundantly generous and forgiving. The workers who only arrived at the vineyard an hour before closing get the same pay as those who had been at work all day. They too had families to feed and look after.

Today's parable is really about Jesus' Father who is a God who wants to be as generous as possible with his gift of eternal life. That is what we are meant to take away from hearing this Gospel and think about during the day. Even those who spend life ignoring God can find forgiveness at the end and a warm welcome in paradise.

In the long run, God gives eternal happiness as an undeserved free gift. Whether we have worked for it a long or a short time is not what ultimately decides whether or not we get it. More important is whether there is space for God in our lives, or have we crowded him out with 'more important things' and do not really feel the need for him.

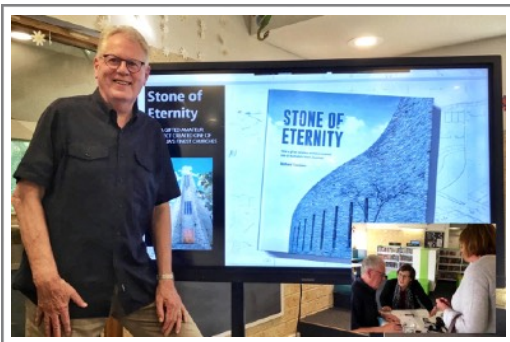
## Author's Talk
