A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid, you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you,' the angel answered, 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord,' said Mary, 'Let what you have said be done to me.' And the angel left her.

FEAST OF OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Praying the Rosary is really very simple. It is like breathing in and out the mysteries of Christ's life with each Hail Mary. We endlessly repeat the same words, taking pleasure in the good news of God's love. We are celebrating that the Lord is really "with us".

We don't have to be thinking about God all the time, we simply enjoy his presence. We are not thinking about our friends all the time they are with us. Rather we simply enjoy their presence. It is when they are absent that we start thinking about them. Thinking about God too easily becomes treating him as if he were absent. But he is not absent.

The Rosary is made up mainly of Hail Marys, a prayer which begins with the greeting of the angel Gabriel to Mary. That greeting proclaims the essence of the good news of the Gospel: "The Lord is with you." That alone gives us enough to be aware of throughout our praying of the Rosary.

So the individual Hail Mary is our prayer as we journey through life. But ultimately our lives only have meaning because they are caught up in a larger story which reaches from the creation to the full glory of God's Kingdom. And this longer span of time is given to us by the mysteries of the Rosary which tell the story of God's leading humanity into eternal life.

We could remember too that children, and we are all God's little children, love to hear the same stories over and over again. And God never gets tired of creating little flowers, millions and millions of them. Many of them look much the same to us, but each one is a precious unique creation of God, like each Hail Mary of ours.

So in the Rosary we need not try to have thoughts about God. Instead we can simply be glad at the words of the angel addressed to each of us, "The Lord is with you." We endlessly repeat these same words with the vitality of the children of God, who take pleasure in hearing good news.

Father Tom explains what this ‘Synod’ and ‘Synodality’ is all about:

The word “Synod” means walking together in the path of Our Lord. For Pope Francis “Synodality” is a way of communicating in which the three parts of the Church – People of God, Bishops and the Bishops of Rome – are in constant exchange, with all three parts listening to better understand our call to holiness and feel the responsibility to participate in the life of the Church. Such participation includes awareness of the need for a wider participation of the People of God in the decision making process that affects the whole Church and in the world.

Of particular concern for Pope Francis is the need to reach out to those on the margins of the Church and society – Catholics who no longer attend church, non-Catholics, non believers, as well as the poor, disabled and elderly. Ideally, a synodal environment should give us a picture of where the Holy Spirit is active in the Church.

This Synod started two years ago with large scale meetings of groups of bishops and mixed groups of bishops, religious and laity around the world responding to the initiative of Pope Francis. The aim of the meetings was to discuss what needs to change in the Church in order for it to become more effective in fulfilling the mission assigned to it by Christ. In particular, where have we gone wrong, for example, clericalism and child abuse, in other words, how authority has been misused; and what positive changes urgently need to be put in place, for example, a more active role of women and lay people in general in the Church’s decision making. The outcome of these meetings from around the world have been sent to Rome and the Vatican has drawn up a working document for the use of the Synod participants who began their meeting in Rome last Wednesday.

There are 464 participants in the Synod, 365 of them have voting rights, 81 of the participants are women, of whom 54 have voting rights. The participants have been divided into 35 working groups of about 10 members. The final Synod document will not appear until after the final meeting of the Synod in October 2024.

Generally speaking, Pope Francis is particularly conscious of two major crises that the Church and the world is living through at the present time, namely, forced migration and climate change. How must the Church respond to these crises if it is to become a prophetic witness to a fragmented and polarized world?
