A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: You must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

We probably need to take time to realise how extraordinary it is that God should tell us that loving each other is of equal importance with loving God. Or, to put it another way, we cannot say we love God if we do not love our neighbour.

And then we have to ask ourselves if we really know what love is: actively doing whatever we can to help our neighbour, all of them in so far as we can.

Isn't it strange that our God should demand our love above everything else. And even stranger still that he accepts our love of our neighbour as proof of our loving him? Isn't that what St Matthew's description of the Last Judgment is all about?

I think the best explanation as to why God should be so insistent that we show love for him and for our neighbour comes from St John. He tells us in one of his inspired letters in our Scriptures that God is Love. And if we share his nature, as St Peter tells us we do in his letter, also a part of our inspired Scriptures, then it's obvious that we should act like God does, and distinguish ourselves as being people who love. After all, from the very beginning of our Bible we learn that we are made in the image of God.

The final argument in favour of our need to actively love all others, even our enemies, is possibly the fact that we cannot say we love God if we do not love what God loves. And God loves everyone, even our enemies, and even us.

We come to Mass to offer our lives to God in union with Jesus' offering of himself, because we are members of his Body. And we receive the Eucharist to remind ourselves that love of ourselves and love of our neighbour and love of Jesus are really the same thing, for we are all one Body in Christ.

"Monday 23 October, 2023

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As I begin writing this letter, I am sitting in Saint Peter's Basilica waiting for the Mass for the Feast of St Luke to begin. I will have you all, and those who are dear to you, in my prayers during this Mass. But I will not finish the letter this morning - it will grow over the coming days. ...

The third week of the Synod Assembly is coming to an end. Towards the middle of next week, the work of gathering the fruits of our assembly will begin in earnest, and decisions will be made about how we carry forward the work of the Synod over the next twelve months. In October of 2024, all the members of the Synod will gather together once again here in Rome to bring the work of the long Synodal journey to a close. We will offer our conclusions to Pope Francis and, together with all of you, await with eager anticipation what he might then offer the Church spread throughout the world. The work of synodality, and the accompanying work of the bishops' collegiality, will reach its culmination in the exercise of the pope's primacy. What will follow will be the implementation phase of the Synod. The People of God in our own part of the world will together listen to the Pope, listen to each other as we discern what God is asking of us through the Pope, and begin the journey of synodality again: listening to each other, listening to the bishops as our leaders in the faith, and listening to the ongoing voice of the pope calling us forward into mission. We are becoming a listening Church, a discerning Church and a faithful, trusting, mission-oriented Church: we are becoming a synodal Church.

May God bless you all, and all who are dear to you.
