A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Get out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Many of you will be familiar with the huge gap between the experience of a marvellous wedding feast and the challenge, difficulties, cost and hard work involved in its preparation. To highlight this gap seems to be the main point of the gospel today about the wise and foolish virgins.

Jesus is trying to illustrate the even wider gap between the joy filled experience of the banquet of eternal life in heaven and the challenge of the preparation required to become fit for that experience. For Matthew's Gospel that involves in particular a life of actively seeking justice in our world, and the constant practice of compassion for those who suffer. And both of these are built on a deep, trusting faith in the love and power of God.

Life in this world is a time of waiting. The date of the final banquet God has to offer us has not yet arrived. But Jesus was sent to us to give out the invitations. We are living in the happy expectation of its coming. And so it is worthwhile to make sure we prepare ourselves for it.

We will do this to the extent that we carry out the love commandment which Matthew describes as a life of trusting faith in God, seeking justice for others, and helping carry the burdens of the suffering.
