

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be guiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclear spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Archaeological research seems to confirm that Capernaum served as Jesus' base for his ministry in Galilee. Mark hastens to tell us that as soon as Jesus had called his first disciples his mission was in full flight. Its two defining features - teaching and healing - are on immediate display. The combined effect is to highlight Jesus' authority. His teaching is authoritative in comparison with that of the scribes and, after his own confrontation with Satan in the wilderness, Jesus' power over the demonic is definitive. Mark will continue to stress Jesus' authority and the impression it made. The fact that Jesus frees the man from the unclear spirit on the sabbath anticipates his declaration that "the Son of Man is master even of the sabbath" (2:28). ...


SPECIAL FEAST

February 2: THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD



This feast is celebrated in our Church forty days after Christmas, marking the day that Mary and Joseph would have brought Jesus into the Temple. Though Mary was pure and free from sin from the moment of her conception, and though the Son of God did not need to be redeemed, Mary and Joseph fulfilled these ritual obligations. At the heart of this celebration is the encounter of Simeon and Anna with the Christ Child in the Temple. It is in that holy encounter that Jesus' divinity is manifested by a human prophet for the first time. At His birth, the angels proclaimed His divinity to the shepherds, but in the Temple, Simeon was the first to understand and proclaim Jesus as the Saviour of the World. He also prophesied that this salvation would be accomplished by a sword of sorrow that would pierce the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
