A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' He said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors

The leper in today's gospel has extraordinary faith. He believes that Jesus has power, belonging to God alone, to free him of his disease. The only question for him is, does Jesus want to heal him.

Jesus wants to. But he knows that if he does he will attract even greater enthusiasm from the crowds who will understand his mission from the Father as simply about curing bodily diseases. Moreover, if he continues his healing he will arouse further opposition from the religious leaders who are losing their following among the people. But Jesus does heal the man and asks him not to publicise his cure.

So this story is not just about another healing. It illustrates the consequences of Jesus entering into the whole human situation of need, which will come to a head in his crucifixion on Calvary, with a cry of abandonment on his lips.

In his Passion Jesus reaches out to the whole of humanity in its cry for healing. His determination to reach out and "touch" us all is clear in his response to the leper, "I do so will".


