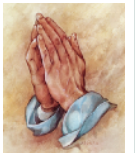

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayers there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors

The gospel today gives us an outline of one day in the life of Jesus. Mark presents it as a typical day. It has special meaning for us because, Mark is saying, Jesus is involved in the same process of building the Kingdom of God on earth among and through us today.

It is all about getting to know the Father more deeply. So Jesus spends a lot of time teaching people, and getting rid of everything that gets in the way of our becoming more fully human images of God, so Jesus heals people.

One way of getting the most out of a gospel reading is imagining ourselves as present at the event being described. In the case of today's gospel, we might identify with Simon and Andrew who were with Jesus. Then we could ask, "What are we learning about the Father whom Jesus came to reveal?" The answer might be, "He is a healer." Do I need healing? Jesus is also a teacher. Do I need to learn about God?

Finally, we might come to the conclusion that what Jesus did on that first day of his public ministry is actually still happening now. In one of the great insights during the Second Vatican Council, the bishops there taught us that, "When the Scriptures are read to us in church, Christ is speaking to us, the People of God." And we might add, when the sacraments are celebrated, especially the Eucharist, Christ is among us offering healing to his people.

The benefits we receive from being here together today depends on the depth of our faith in these two propositions.

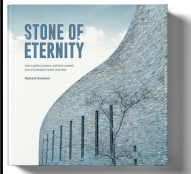
UFO CRAFT
