A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to just what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believe the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believe in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Here's a thought. Everyone has heard the story of Jesus beating up the traders and money changers in the Temple in Jerusalem and sending them home with their cattle, sheep and pigeons. But this is not the main point of today's gospel.

Believe it or not, it is all about our intimacy with God. For the Israelites the Temple was the principal place where God dwelt among his people. But today Jesus is saying it doesn't matter if the Temple is destroyed. Jesus himself will rise from the dead after three days, and his body will become the primary dwelling place of God among his people.

And we are members of that body! Can we believe that? We are members of the Body of Christ on earth. And Jesus is the presence of God among his people. Can we be more intimate with God than that? That is the main point of the gospel. Maybe have another read of it.

When we receive the Body of Christ in the Eucharist today we are being reminded of who we are.

Last year we had 1,308 occasions where we helped members of our community consisting of :-

- 153 visits
- 25 transport trips to appointments and events (health and personal)
- 303 transport trips to Mass
- 176 meals
- 77 assists in the home from putting bins out, to sorting out houses for moves, cleaning and shopping
- 45 gardening services watering plants, weeding and pruning
- 439 Parish assistance includes delivering newsletter and/or Communion to those unable to make it to mass; and
- 90 Parish events including monthly morning teas after Mass, UFO Crafts, serving morning teas after a funeral etc

We currently have 65 volunteers and we thank them for all that they have contributed to our parish community.
