A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL
ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up
as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert,
so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him.
Yes, God loved the world so much
that he gave his only Son,
so that everyone who believed in him may not be lost
but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world
not to condemn the world,
but so that through him the world might be saved.
No one who believes in him will be condemned;
but whoever refused to believe is condemned already
because he has refused to believe
in the name of God's only Son.

On these grounds is sentence pronounced:
that though the light has come into the world
men have shown they prefer
darkness to the light
because their deeds were evil.

And indeed, everybody who does wrong
hates the light and avoids it,
for fear his actions should be exposed;
but the man who lives by the truth
comes out into the light,
so that it may be plainly seen
that what he does is done in God.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Do you feel in need of being rescued? One way or another, I would guess that most of us do at some stage in our lives. But today's gospel is inviting us to see our world as a whole in need of rescue. Given the condition of our world at present, I think that is easy.

And yet, according to the Gospel it is not as simple as that. Our world has in fact already been rescued from all that would disfigure or destroy it. That was why God sent his Son into our world. So why aren't we all loving each other and caring for the earth?

The best way I know to explain that is to say that the remedy needed by us and our world, which is God's grace, is now available to us through Christ. We only have to believe, and ask for it, and live it.

If our eyes are open we see God's grace at work among us every day of our lives. We have Jesus to thank for that. But there is a lot of refusal of grace as well. And yet we believe that in the end God's grace will be more powerful than sin. And so we live in hope founded on the power and love of God. The rescue work is still under way and we are all invited to join in as members of the Body of Christ.

ROSARY CARE

Last year we had 1,308 occasions where we helped members of our community consisting of :-

- 153 visits
- 25 transport trips to appointments and events (health and personal)
- 303 transport trips to Mass
- 176 meals
- 77 assists in the home - from putting bins out, to sorting out houses for moves, cleaning and shopping
- 45 gardening services - watering plants, weeding and pruning
- 439 Parish assistance includes delivering newsletter and/or Communion to those unable to make it to mass; and
- 90 Parish events including monthly morning teas after Mass, UFO Crafts, serving morning teas after a funeral etc.

We currently have 65 volunteers and we thank them for all that they have contributed to our parish community.
