The Tenancy Lawyer supports the Director in their role and assists them to coordinate the Tenancy Advocate Assistants and volunteers. The successful candidate must hold an unrestricted legal Australian Practising Certificate and have knowledge of the Residential Tenancies Act WA (1987). A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

(Sunday of the Resurrection of The Lord)

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

Dear friends, this Easter, I invite you to remember that Jesus Christ, risen from the dead and alive with us, is at the heart of Easter, just as he is at the heart of the Church, and of every aspect of the Church's life.

He calls to us and asks us to make room for Him so that He can be the companion on our journey, enabling us by His presence among us to love as He did.

I invite each and every one of you to open your hearts to Him, let Him be the way you follow, the truth you believe and the life you live - and do not be afraid, for He loves us with an everlasting love. May you all have a Happy and Holy Easter.

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL


Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

We Christians have grown up out of that small group of women and men who saw Jesus after his Resurrection. But we have never seen him, talked with him, or walked with him. Nevertheless, the Easter gospel stories are trying hard to help us see that that doesn't matter.

Whenever we listen to the Gospel and celebrate the Eucharist at Mass, Jesus is just as truly with us as he was with his first disciples. And he remains with us as a companion on our journey, as he was on theirs.

The emptiness of the tomb assures us that God is still reaching out into our world. He is still "Emmanuel", God with us. Jesus is continuing his rescue mission to humanity, healing and sharing the gift of his own life with the Father and the Holy Spirit. As He announced at the start of his mission, we are still in the Lord's year of favour, and we have been called to join him in his rescue mission.
