

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL

Dear Parishioners and Visitors


After John the Baptist had baptized Jesus in the river Jordan, the Gospels tell us that the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus and he heard the voice of God calling him his Son and telling him he loved him. It is not often we hear about the intimate communications between the Persons of the Blessed Trinity. Here John, the Gospel writer, is giving us an image of the Blessed Trinity. The Father sends the Holy Spirit upon the Son he loves to guide, and strengthens him for his mission to save humanity from all that harms them.

If it sometimes seems as though Jesus was not very successful in this mission from his Father, I think we have to try and understand that God's perspective is different from ours. It will not be until Jesus comes again in glory that we will really be able to judge the success of Jesus in his mission. But, strangely, God sees it now.

In our gospel today Jesus tells his closest disciples that they too must wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit on them. Then they will be empowered to continue Jesus' ministry of forgiveness and healing.

What about us? We too are not asked to do anything we are not empowered to do by the Holy Spirit's coming upon us. The challenge is in discovering what are the gifts we have been given by the Spirit, and then being generous in using them to help others
