#### TRAINING EVENING

Last Tuesday night, 30 April, our Parish Acolytes and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion came together in the church for a refresher training evening. Jocelyn, from the Archdiocesan Centre for Liturgy, provided information about these ministries and their importance in our liturgies.

The group also discussed a number of practical aspects relating to carrying out their roles during Mass. Fr Peter went on to explain that the liturgy of the Mass is celebrated by the whole church, with Christ as the head, so everyone has a role to participate fully and actively. This includes responding to and proclaiming prayers, and joining in with singing. In particular, the procession of the gifts is important as it symbolises the congregation's participation in the Eucharist.

Following the presentation, the group moved to the Rosary Centre for light refreshments.

## A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me. so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another. as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends You are my friends, if you do what I command you. I shall not call you servants any more. because a servant does not know his master's business: I call you friends. because I have made know to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me. no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that will last; and then the Father will give you anything you ask in my name. What I command you

is to love one another.'

#### **COMMENTARY ON THE GOSPEL**

Dear Parishioners and Visitors

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you."
But the Father loves Jesus with an infinite love which is his very nature. Jesus has explained how much he loves us in the story of the good shepherd. It is extravagant and even seems unreal. But that is the way the Father loves Jesus and us.

He tells us to remain in his love by keeping the commandments. His commandments are the two love commands. It seems that Jesus' love is in us to the extent that we love others in the way he loves us. And he is always empowering us to love others as he loves.

Jesus' love for us is a share in the love which is God's life and nature. And so we are enabled to love God and each other as a result of Jesus' love for us. It becomes "natural" for us to love others in the way God loves us because we share God's nature. Then, and only then, will our joy be complete.

After hearing about the extravagant love Christ has for his own in the story of the good shepherd, it is a great challenge to be told by him "to love one another as I have loved you."

Being part of the vine which is Christ empowers us to, "love one another as I have loved you." That is why we are here celebrating the Eucharist, because it helps to keep us firmly attached to the vine.
