Than the spots on the sun abiding.


The current of life runs ever away

St. Benedict was the founder of the Benedictine monastery at Monte Cassino and father of Western monasticism; the Rule that he established became the norm for monastic living throughout Europe. In 1964, in view of the work of monks following the Benedictine Rule in the evangelisation and civilisation of so many European countries in the Middle Ages, Pope Paul VI proclaimed him the patron saint of all Europe.

A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Josef and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

LIVING THE GOSPEL THIS WEEK

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

All four gospels are full of stories of people's faith. That is, of people's coming to a deeper understanding of God's loving presence in their lives, and so gratefully accepting a loving relationship with this God. But today's gospel is a story about a refusal to believe in Jesus by the people of his own town.

The people of Nazareth found it very hard to believe that Jesus was really someone special sent by God to establish his Kingdom on earth. They thought that since they had known him since he was a little boy, he was just the same as them.

The first point of this story for us is that God's presence can come to us in as familiar a form as the person next door. That is what the people of Nazareth found so hard to accept. Why should God use Jesus rather than any of them? They thought they knew God well enough to know what to expect from him.

This story reminds us that if our relationship with God is deepening, it will nearly always mean that we begin to see God's presence more and more in the ordinary and everyday people and events, and especially, according to the Gospel, in the poor and afflicted.

God's Son not only became a human being. He took human form in such a very insignificant and ordinary out of the way place as Nazareth. Mark's gospel invites us to reflect on where the "Nazareths" are in our own lives - places and situations where God might be present but not yet recognised by us.
