A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff - no bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals, but, he added, 'Do not take a spare tunic.' And he said to them, 'If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them.' So they set off to preach repentance; and they cast out many devils, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.


LIVING THE GOSPEL THIS WEEK

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Have you ever wondered why the gospels have so much to say about eating and drinking? There are the two miracles of the loaves and fishes, the marriage feast at Cana, Zacchaeus's celebratory feast after Jesus called him down from the tree, the feast where a woman poured ointment over Jesus' feet, Jesus' last supper with his disciples, his further meal with them after the resurrection, and there were others. I want to suggest that the entire gospel story is about giving and receiving hospitality.

Some of us like entertaining, some of us prefer to be entertained. Some people like giving parties, other like going to them. In today's gospel Jesus is sending out his disciples to neighbouring

villages. The idea is that they are to offer people the hospitality of God. They are to invite anyone who will listen to them into the kingdom of God which Jesus himself describes as a great marriage feast, with God playing host. Life in the kingdom starts now, with the forgiveness of sins and a share in God's own love to pass on to others. This will come to its fullness when we join Christ in his resurrection





At Mass we eat and drink Jesus' body and blood. That reminds us of the great feast that awaits us in the Kingdom, and it gives us the nourishment we need to prepare ourselves to be fit for the company of God, his angels and saints.
